CLOAK ROOMS.

Cloak Rooms—4th door Cathedral Street, 62 Dawson Street, and at Clontarf, Kingsbridge, and Terenure Offices.

The ATTENTION of Traders, Shopkeepers and the Public generally is called to the GREAT ADVANTAGES of the TRAMWAYS PARCELS EXPRESS.

The Public are requested to note

- That** There is a constant service to all parts of the City and Suburbs, thus ensuring Prompt Deliveries.
- That** Parcels are collected on receipt of letter, post card, &c., or on notice handed to the Conductor of any car, and quick delivery of same is made.
- That** The ordinary Passenger Cars are utilized for the conveyance of Parcels, thus providing a constant service.
- That** Messengers are stationed at the Central and Branch Offices and at District Stations, and deliver parcels immediately on arrival there.
- That** The outlying portions of the Parcels Express District are covered by a service of Messengers and Vans, the latter of which also deal with heavy parcels.
- That** Collections are made at frequent intervals in the city and within the Parcels Express District

- That** Van or Messengers will call at Warehouses, Shops, &c., at arranged hours for the Collection of Parcels, on application at Company's Office.
- That** Parcels are received by Conductors of all Cars *en route to the City from 8.30 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.*
- That** On Kingsbridge and Inchicore Lines Conductors will receive parcels on the journey from Westland Row or College Green, from 9 o'clock a.m., to 5.30 o'clock p.m.
- That** The system extends to all Stations of the Dublin and South Eastern Railway as far as Groystones.
- That** The system extends to the Clontarf and Hill of Howth Tramroad Line, with free delivery or collection within one mile of Sutton Cross and Howth Terminus.
- That** Parcels are Collected free for England and Scotland per London and North Western Railway System and connections
- That** Passengers' luggage in advance is collected and forwarded per L. and N. W. system and connections.
- That** Parcels for abroad are collected and forwarded per Neale and Wilkinson's Foreign Express.
- That** Through Booking arrangements are in existence with Dublin and Blessington and Dublin and Lucan Tramways.
- That** Passengers' luggage will be delivered at any Railway Cloak-room in Dublin. A voucher is required which should be obtained at the Company's Parcels Station when booking. Conductors cannot receive luggage addressed to a Railway Cloak-room.

EXPRESS MESSENGER SERVICE.

In cases where urgent and immediate delivery of a parcel is required, Special Messengers will be provided on application, by telephone or otherwise, at Central Office, who will at once convey parcel direct to destination at a charge of 6d. per parcel in addition to the ordinary charge.

This arrangement only applies to the City of Dublin and within one mile of the Company's District Stations.

CONDITIONS UPON WHICH PARCELS ARE ACCEPTED.

The Company is not responsible for injury to breakable goods unless properly packed, marked as breakable, so declared at time of booking, and an extra rate paid on same. Such goods are otherwise accepted SOLELY AT OWNER'S RISK.
